



AMERICAN ARCHITECTURAL FOUNDATION 2004 KEYSTONE AWARD NOMINATION INFORMATION

THE AMERICAN ARCHITECTURAL FOUNDATION (AAF) is a 501(c)(3) educational organization dedicated to advancing design excellence as a catalyst for citizen engagement and the creation of more livable communities. The Keystone Award was created to honor an individual whose exemplary leadership has emphasized the fundamentality of design to the identity of a community and the quality of life experienced by its inhabitants.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Nominees for the AAF Keystone Award must have a record of using design to enrich lives and transform their communities. They must show a commitment to fostering public involvement in the design process.

Design professionals are ineligible, as are employees or relatives of employees of AAF. Current members of the AAF Board of Regents, the AIA Boards of Directors, and the Keystone Award Selection Committee, or relatives of the above, are ineligible to receive the award. A period of two years must lapse following service on these bodies before a former member may become eligible.

The AAF Keystone Award will be given without regard to race, color, religion, age, sex, or national origin. An individual may not be nominated for the award posthumously.

NOMINATING PROCEDURE

Nominations for the AAF Keystone Award may be submitted by any person having sufficient knowledge of the nominee's qualifications. Complete submissions must be postmarked no later than October 15, 2003. Nominations will be accepted by facsimile at 202-626-7420 or by mail. Nominations and supporting materials will not be returned. Address submissions to:

Each submission should include a completed nomination form and a nomination letter.

The nomination letter should present the background of the nominee and clearly cite his or her qualifications to receive the award.

SELECTION PROCESS

A committee of the AAF Board of Regents will evaluate the nominations on merit and submit the name of the recommended recipient to the entire AAF Board of Regents for ratification, reserving the right to defer an award in any year it determines there is no suitable nomination. The award is tentatively scheduled to be presented at the 2004 Accent on Architecture Gala, which will be held on March 3, 2004, in Washington, DC.



The AAF Keystone Award is presented annually at the Accent on Architecture Gala in Washington, DC. For fifteen years this event has brought together members and friends of the design professions from around the world to celebrate the visionary use of architecture to improve the human condition. Hosted by AAF, this event is the only gathering of its kind and provides an ideal platform for the presentation of the award.
